The meeting was held at the Town Hall on Thursday, December 9, 1993 at 7:00 p.m.

First on the agenda, David Caron advised the other Board members that Barbara Clancy sent a letter to the Board concerning Detector Technology; notice of this meeting and an invitation to appear before the Board was verbally given to Ms. Clancy by the Board's Clerk. Ms. Clancy was scheduled to be first on the Agenda. Richard Hope then advised the Board members that, in fact, a letter notifying Detector Technology that a 21E had to be performed before the property could be sold or occupied was sent to Detector Technology by both regular and certified mail on December 6, 1994 and December 7, 1994, respectively.

At approximately 7:05 p.m., Barbara Clancy, Eileen Perron, Peter and Mary Bull and Jackie (a former employee of Detector Technology who has had lead testing done and has confirmed high levels of lead in her blood) appeared before the Board to present their concerns relative to Detector Technology (e.g., wanted to know who would be responsible for overseeing where samples are taken and to ascertain that the abutters would be notified of the date and time of testing and of the results thereof). Ms. Clancy advised the Board members that an extremely high rate of cancer existed among the residents of the area abutting Detector Technology and that it was time to find out what, in fact, was in the soil surrounding the property.

David Caron advised that a member of the Board would be present during the 21E testing and that all abutters would be notified of the 21E testing date and the subsequent results thereof.

At approximately 7:25 p.m., Mr. Heller (presently renting the property with the option to buy) as well as representative of the Planning Board also appeared before the Board with respect to this matter. Mr. Heller advised the Board that Detector Technology had not removed the draw tower as requested previously by the Board. The Planning Board's inquiry involved how to assess the layout, etc., for the septic? Richard Hope suggested that Mark Farrell should look at the septic to assess it.

MOTION was made by David Caron, seconded by Lawrence Peck

and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to call Peter Graves of Detector Technology and Order him to move the draw tower and machinery.

MOTION was made by Lawrence Peck, seconded by David Caron and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to advise all abutters, Mr. Heller and the members of the Planning Board when and where the 21E testing would be performed and the results thereof. It was also UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to provide the Planning Board with notice of when the septic was, in fact, in compliance.

Second on the Agenda, Ed Jeuder appeared before the Board and made a request to have the Board send a diagram of the layout at the town dump, via facsimile, to Lorraine for purposes of obtaining a container to store the aluminum cans at the Town dump.

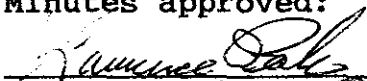

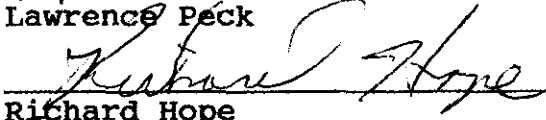

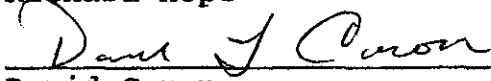
