The meeting was held at the Town Hall on Saturday, June 3, 1995 at 10:00 a.m.

First on the Agenda, David Caron called the meeting to Order.

Second on the Agenda, David Caron indicated that guidelines needed to be established as to when septic inspections were needed and not needed (e.g., repairs to a house should not require septic inspection). It was his suggestion that the Building Inspector send individuals directly to the Board of Health first and then to the Town Engineer, if necessary. David Caron indicated that he would further discuss the matter with Mark Farrell, Town Engineer and the Building Inspector for their feedback on the issue.

Third on the Agenda, David Caron advised the Board that there was a Spencer resident interested in the Health Agent position and that he would invite her to the next Board Meeting.

Fourth on the Agenda, the Clerk indicated that the Board had received an application to participate in the Failed Septic Grant Program and that it was necessary to obtain the vote of both the Selectmen and the Board of Health. Robert Wentzell made a Motion, which was Seconded by David Caron; the Board of Health UNANIMOUSLY VOTED in favor of participating in the failed septic grant program. The Clerk was then instructed to pass the information and form along to the Board of Selectmen for further action, as necessary.

Fifth on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell indicated that the water samples taken from South Pond were acceptable and that the quality of the water was fine for swimming.

Sixth on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell indicated that Richard D'Angelo of BFI had contacted him concerning the Town's recyclables and his interest in picking up the Town's accounts. Mr. D'Angelo indicated that he would put in two (2) containers for cardboard and could pick up everything and anything. Robert Wentzell then expressed his concern that the Town had not made money on recyclables in the past. He further indicated that recyclables could bring a profit to the Town and that he would like to further investigate the matter. He also indicated that BFI could lay the groundwork for curbside collection or a transfer station when the time approached.

Seventh on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell indicated that he had not

more responses.

Eighth on the Agenda, Robert Ayers indicated his willingness to attend a meeting with the Board of Health and North Brookfield Selectmen to discuss landfill closure options.

Ninth on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell indicated that he had spoken with the Advisory Board and that it was suggested that the Board put an article on the Town Warrant to obtain monies for the Feasible Trucking bill and other incidentals. David Caron made a Motion, which was SECONDED by Robert Wentzell and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED that the Clerk would prepare an Article for the Town Warrant for purposes of same.

Tenth on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell expressed the need to establish Dump Sticker Rules and suggested the following:

1. Dump Stickers will be sold and purchased at the Town Dump only.
2. The cost for a dump sticker is \$50.00 per year for one (1) sticker. Two (2) vehicle families may purchase an additional sticker for \$1.00.
3. Dump stickers will be applied by the Landfill Attendant to the vehicle. The sticker will be placed upon the inner, lower, left hand side of the windshield.
4. Dump stickers will be available for purchase on or about the third or fourth week in June.
5. Individuals who have a dump sticker for 1994/95, will be permitted to enter the dump until July 8, 1995. However, after July 8, 1995, no one will be permitted in the dump without a 1995/96 dump sticker.
6. Any one determined to be dumping rubbish in excess of the amount considered normal for the average household will be charged \$12 per yard; said determination will be made by the Board of Health and/or Landfill Monitor.

Motion was then made by Robert Wentzell and SECONDED by David Caron; the Board UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to adopt the rules set forth above and that the Clerk would prepare a typewritten list of Rules for distribution to Town Residents.

Eleventh on the Agenda, David Caron made a Motion, which was seconded by Robert Wentzell and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to adjourn the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
