

**TOWN OF BROOKFIELD
BOARD OF HEALTH**

* Members present: David Caron, Robert Wentzell and Sandra Guyette. Also present, Ronald Nicoll.

The meeting was held at the Town Hall on Friday, July 14, 1995 at 7:00 p.m.

First on the Agenda, David Caron advised the Board that the purpose of the meeting was to address Ronald Nicoll's resignation from the Board of Health and his interest in being appointed as Health Agent. Mr. Caron noted that the Board of Selectmen approved the appointment, but were awaiting approval from the Board of Health as well. After a brief discussion concerning Mr. Nicoll's capability of performing the job, David Caron made a MOTION, which was SECONDED by Robert Wentzell, and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED that the Board would appoint Ronald Nicoll as Health Agent for purposes of handling domestic affairs, taking care of license fees, etc., but that all matters would be directed to the Board of Health first and that Mr. Nicoll would receive his instructions from the Board. Mr. Caron also indicated at that time that applications for the now vacant Board of Health position would be accepted until August 4, 1995.

Second on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell again addressed his concerns about the quantity of building materials, etc., being dumped at the landfill. He indicated that it was in the best interest of the Town to control the amount of loads being dumped. As such, Robert Wentzell, made a Motion, which was SECONDED by David Caron and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to have the Secretary send a letter to Al Varnum requesting that Mr. Varnum make only single loads here and there and not multiple loads, until further notice.

Third on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell indicated that he had received a proposal from BFI and that BFI was willing to take mixed metal, glass and plastics for \$250 per haul, but that the Town would get nothing back and with respect to cardboard, it would \$150 per haul and the Town would get \$75 back. He indicated that BFI would take anything, but that the Town would not make any money. David Caron indicated that it was his feeling that the Town was better off to get rid of it now, seeing there was only six more months of life remaining to the landfill. It was agreed that Robert Wentzell would further negotiate with B.F.I. for purposes of obtaining a better proposal.

Fourth on the Agenda, Robert Wentzell indicated that a Police Officer would be present at the landfill for purposes of enforcing the sticker permits and that individuals could be fined if they pushed going into the landfill without a permit.

Fifth on the Agenda, all matters having been addressed David Caron made a Motion, which was SECONDED by Robert Wentzell and it was UNANIMOUSLY VOTED to adjourn the meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
