The Board of Selectmen met at One O'Clock in the Afternoon with Captain Jonah of the Army Engineering Corps to inspect the flood damage to roads and bridges in the Town of Brookfield. Mr. John Morrill, our Street Superintendent, went with us, and we inspected the damage to the bridge over Freeman's Brook, the bridge on Schoolhouse Road, and the bridge at Mill Pond. We also went over the Long Hill Road where there had been extensive washouts. Mr. Glass, Mr. Mauhin and Mr. Terry of the Water Department went with us to the Town Reservoir to look at the damage to the dam and spillway.

After the completion of the field trip it was agreed that Mr. Jonah that the Town would apply to the Army Engineers for assistance in rebuilding the following:

- 1) Freeman Brook Bridge on Weber Road - Also stream clearance on both sides of the bridge.
- 2) Small bridge on Schoolhouse Road.
- 3) The stream clearance on the North Side of Mill Pond Bridge.
- 4) The rebuilding of about 1500 Ft. of the Long Hill Road.
- 5) Repairing dam and spillway at the Reservoir

The Board met again at 8:00 P.M. to sign bills and take care of routine business.

The Meeting was adjourned at 9:30 P.M.



The Board received a letter from Mr. Paolucci's attorney requesting that we consider his application for a package store licence in place of his present all alcohol licence. It was decided to make no decision at the present time, and to bring this matter up for discussion at our next meeting.

The Board met with the Chief of Police, Mr. Guerin, and Deputy Chief, Mr. Wentzell, to discuss recent complaints to the Board concerning lack of police protection in the Town during the early evening hours. The store owners on Central Street have had some damage to property by groups of teenagers when police protection was not available.

It was decided that there would be police officers on duty several nights a week to try and bring this problem under control. No specific time has been agreed upon because it was felt it would be better if the exact hours and time of duty were not known.

The Halloween program was discussed, and it was voted to have police officers on duty Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights for the Halloween weekend. A notice was being sent to the newspapers stating that "Trick or Treat" would be Sunday night only and that police officers were instructed to restrict children's activities to that particular night. The police department is going to have a program for the younger children and a parade on Monday night.

Mrs. Bonner also came to the Meeting to protest Mr. Paolucci's application and requested that the Board take no action.

Mr. Philip Quinn, our State Representative, was present at our Meeting and discussed our progress on getting State and Federal assistance on flood relief. Mr. Quinn is going to attempt to expedite the rebuilding of the bridge on Weber Road.
