Selectmen:

The month of January, 2008 was down in overall incidences. Weather played a factor in some cases. We had several complaints of ATVs racing down the roadway near Wagon Wheel Mobile Home Park and EPOs were contacted to assist with this matter. This has been an ongoing problem in this area.

The Police Department did a survey of driveways that had snow removed across the roadways. This will be followed up with the Board of Selectmen and the By-Law Committee. There was an investigation into trash being dumped on Town Farm Rd which is still pending. We also covered several unattended deaths one was released to the State Police Detectives.

We also worked on the applications for the full-time position. There are several good candidates so the hiring board has its hands full. After a selection is made a background check will need to be done. This department assisted MSP with a C-16 with a seriously injured male who needed to be put on Life Flight. Following the accident we assisted with accident reconstruction.


The department had (3) arrests for the month... (1) A&B w/Dangerous Weapon, Resisting Arrest and Minor in Possession of Alcohol.(2) 209A Violation, (3) Warrant and (4) OUI, Negligent Operation and Speeding.

There were (5) criminal applications...(1) Suspended License, Registration Suspended and Uninsured Motor Vehicle, (2) Assault, Disorderly Conduct & Disturbing the Peace, (3) Larceny by Check Under \$250, (4) Speeding, Reckless Operation & Marked Lanes.

Several officers and I have spoke with Brenda Metterville the Librarian on ideas for monthly programs involving the Brookfield Police Department. Officer Abair will work these programs into his schedule along with more communication between the librarian and I. We are looking forward for the bicycle safety day at the library.

We are also going to be meeting with several elderly groups about mail fraud and scams against the elderly.
