At the annual Adjourned Town Meeting held at the Brookfield Elementary School in the Town of Brookfield, Friday, March 5, 1971 at 7 p.m. the following By-Laws were voted subject to your approval:

ARTICLE 35. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following By-Law as Chapter 11, Section 5 of the Town By-Laws:

No person shall in any street or other public place, meet or address another person with profane or obscene language and/or with an obscene gesture.

Any person violating this by-law or portion thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty (\$50.00) for each offense.

It was voted to adopt the following By-Law as Chapter 11, Section 5 of the Town By-Laws:

No person shall in any street or other public place, meet or address another person with profane or obscene language and/or with an obscene gesture.

Any person violating this by-law or portion thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty (\$50.00) for each offense.

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING, MARCH 5, 1971

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds in the Treasury, a sum of money for Chapter 81 Highways, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,700.00 for Chapter 81 Highways.

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds in the Treasury, a sum of money for Chapter 90 Highway Maintenance.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,150.00 for Chapter 90 Highway Maintenance.

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$7,820.61 apportioned to the Town of Brookfield by the Massachusetts Department of Public Works in accordance with Section 5 of Chapter 768 of the Acts of 1969 to be used for the purpose of reconstruction, maintenance, and repairs of public highways and bridges, and of the enforcement of traffic laws for the calendar year 1971, or take any action relative thereto.

This Article 6 was amended to read - To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$7,820.61 apportioned to the Town of Brookfield by the Massachusetts Department of Public Works in accordance with Section 5 of Chapter 768 of the Acts of 1969.

This Article 6 as amended was defeated.

It was voted that the Town accept the sum of \$7,820.61 apportioned to the Town of Brookfield by the Massachusetts Department of Public Works in accordance with Section 5 of Chapter 768 of the Acts of 1969 as reimbursement for the purpose of reconstruction, maintenance and repairs of public highways and bridges, and of the enforcement of traffic laws for the calendar year 1970 and deposited into the general fund.

Article 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds in the Treasury, a sum of money for Chapter 90 Construction or take any action relative thereto.

This Article 7 was amended to read - To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$393.13 and transfer \$2,606.87 from Chapter 768 of the Acts of 1969 for Chapter 90 Construction.

This Article 7 as amended was defeated.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Chapter 90 Construction.




