ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 1, Chapter 12 of the Town By-laws by striking out "Within a radius of one mile from the Central Street" and "For a period of at least six weeks falling between May 1st and July 15th, said period to conform as nearly as possible with the period in which home gardens are customarily planted and started into growth, due consideration being given to variation from year to year resulting from climatic conditions." And add after the word leash "or being used while hunting, field trials or for training purposes." The by-law will be thus: The Selectmen shall, as authorized by Section 167, Chapter 140, of the General Laws, require that all dogs be kept in continuous restraint upon the premises of owner, except when on a leash, or being used while hunting, field trials or for training purposes.

Dear Mrs. Giguere:

We have received a copy of a letter addressed to you from Joseph G. Puchalski, in which letter Mr. Puchalski protests a vote under Article 1 of a special town meeting held on February 18, 1972, whereby a motion to borrow the sum of \$292,000 was amended to \$410,000, the motion to amend being carried by a vote of 75 to 42, and the subsequent vote under said amendment was carried by a vote of 89 to 31.

Mr. Puchalski's letter in this instance indicates that he is under the impression that a two thirds vote is required under the amendment, as well as on the vote.

In this connection, I submit to you a quotation from "Robert's Rules of Order", under Rule No. 33 for town meeting procedures, as follows:

"An amendment of a pending question requires only a majority vote for its adoption, even though the question to be amended requires a two-thirds vote."

It would appear, based upon this quotation, that the article and subsequent action, a copy of which was submitted by Mr. Puchalski, are in proper form.
