ARTICLE 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$5,000.00 for the Recreation Committee to complete the baseball field on the Lewis Property or take any action relative thereto.

It was moved to transfer \$5,000.00 from the Stabilization Account.

A motion was made to pass over this article. The vote was 34 in favor and 34 opposed. Randall Whitehead, moderator cast his vote against passing over the article.

A motion was made to change the word "complete" to "continue" and this motion as amended was defeated. 39 in favor and 33 opposed. 2/3 vote required.

ARTICLE 34 To see if the Town will vote to transfer all its rights, title and interest to vehicular bridges No. B-26-4 Railroad No. 65.96 and B-26-3 Railroad No. 6694 carrying public ways over the tracks or right of way of railroads within the Town of Brookfield to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts through the Department of Public Works, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 634 of the Acts of 1971 or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over this article

ARTICLE 35 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Reserve Account, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer from Overlay Surplus, \$8,000.00 for the Reserve Account. Meeting adjourned at 10:40 P.M.
