IN THE NAME OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town, qualified to vote in elections and in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Banquet Hall in said Town on Monday the Fifth day of November next, at 7:30 o'clock in the after noon, then and there to act on the following articles:-

The Meeting opened at 7:35 P.M. 36 voters present.

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,400.00 from available funds in the treasury to be used by the Assessors for the publishing of a tax valuation book or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to transfer the sum of \$1,400.00 from available funds in the treasury to be used by the Assessors for the publishing of a tax valuation book. This motion was questioned by the moderator because he thought that the funds should come from a specific account. It was voted to pass over Article 1.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$3,000.00 to be used by the Water Department to chemically treat the Brookfield water for corrective p.h. and corrosion control or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to transfer the sum of \$3,000.00 from available funds in the treasury be used by the Water Department to chemically treat the Brookfield water for corrective p.h. and corrosion control. A recess was called at 7:40 P.M. so that the Advisory Board could determine what funds were available. At 8:05 P.M. a motion was made and voted to pass over Article 2 and reconsider it later.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,897.78 received from the Department of Fisheries and Wildlife as reimbursement for work done on the Lake Quaboag Boat Ramp to the HIGHWAY MACHINERY MAINTENANCE FUND AND PURCHASE OF NEW EQUIPMENT ACCOUNT or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made and voted ^{to} skip the money articles at this time and act on Article 6.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with the Division of Fisheries and Wildlife for the purpose of leasing property located within the Quaboag Wildlife Management Area adjacent to Route 148 or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 2. A motion was made to transfer the sum of \$3,000.00 from the Overlay Reserve account to be used by the Water Department to chemically treat the Brookfield water for corrective p.h. and corrosion control. A discussion as to whether that was the proper account followed. It was then voted to transfer the \$3,000.00 from the Stabilization. (An illegal vote, Chapter 40, Section 5B G.L.) Vote was unanimous

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$2,000.00 from available funds in the treasury to the Highway Machinery Maintenance fund and purchase of New Equipment Account or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$4,000.00 from available funds in the treasury to the Municipal Fuel Account or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$200.00 from available funds in the treasury for the purpose of entering into an agreement for the leasing of property from the Department of Fisheries and Wildlife or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer the sum of \$200.00 from FREE CASH for the purpose of entering into an agreement for the leasing of property from the Department of Fisheries and Wildlife.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$300.00 from available funds in the treasury to the Dog Officer's Expense Account or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to transfer \$300.00 from the Stabilization fund. Another motion to pass over this article was defeated. It was then voted to transfer \$300.00 from Overlay Reserve Account to the Dog Officer's Expense Account.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,990.00 from Available Funds in the Treasury for the purpose of purchasing and constructing a dog pound or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to transfer \$1,990.00 from the Overlay Reserve Account for the purpose of purchasing and constructing a dog pound. Another motion was made to put the dog pound at the present town landfill permanently. This motion was withdrawn and it was then voted to transfer the sum of \$1,990.00 from the Overlay Reserve Account for the purpose of purchasing and constructing a dog pound.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$100.00 from Available Funds in the Treasury to be used with the sum of \$300.00 appropriated at the 1979 Annual Town Meeting for the purpose of printing the Town By-Laws or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer the sum of \$100.00 from Overlay Reserve Account to be used with the sum of \$300.00 appropriated at the 1979 Annual Town Meeting for the purpose of printing the Town By-Laws.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$60.00 from Available Funds in the Treasury to pay for legal services incurred by Patrolman David Olson, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer \$60.00 from Overlay Reserve Account to pay for legal services incurred by Patrolman David Olson.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$100.00 from Available Funds in the Treasury to the Building Inspector's Expense Account or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer the sum of \$100.00 from the Overlay Reserve Account to the Building Inspector's Expense Account.

Meeting adjourned at 9:10 P.M.
