ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate transfer or borrow the sum of \$16,800.00 to spray with the insecticide "Seven", the 2,100 acres within the Town which have been infected by gypsy moths, or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 to spray the roadsides with the insecticide "Seven" within the Town which have been infested by gypsy moths. It was then voted to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$2,850.00 for the treatment of weeds in Mill Pond, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over Article 8.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$100.00 to be used for the purchase of one window and four cages for the Dog Pound, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over Article 9.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$8,500.00 to supplement the Police Department budget, or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to pass over this article. This motion was defeated 90 to 73. It was then voted to conduct a secret ballot. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,500.00 to supplement the Police Department budget. Vote was 97 In Favor, 82 Opposed.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate transfer or borrow the sum of approximately \$8,600.00 for the purchase and installation of steel snow guard roof railings for the Town Hall or take any action relative thereto.

IT WAS VOTED TO PASS OVER ARTICLE 11.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from available funds the sum of \$7,000.00 to be added to the sum appropriated at the Annual Town Meeting to make necessary energy conservation repairs and additions to the fire station, or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to raise and appropriate \$7,000.00 to be added to the sum appropriated at the Annual Town Meeting to make necessary energy conservation repairs and additions to the Fire Station. A motion to amend this sum to \$3,250.00 was defeated. Another motion to amend the amount to \$10,000.00 was defeated. It was then voted not to raise and appropriate \$7,000.00 to be added to the sum appropriated at the Annual Town Meeting to make necessary energy conservation repairs and additions to the fire station. Vote was 51 in favor of the article and 52 opposed. A motion to reconsider the article was termed illegal because it was made by the defeated side.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$26.00 to be paid to Lawrence Bowers or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over Article 13.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate transfer or borrow the sum of \$200.00 to be used to purchase a dog carrier for the Dog Officer, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to pass over Article 14.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$20,922.00 to supplement the Instructional and Special Education Budgets for the Brookfield Elementary School, or take any action relative thereto.

A motion to pass over this Article was refused by the moderator because he wanted a discussion of the article first. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$20,922.00 to supplement the Instructional and Special Education Budgets for the Brookfield Elementary School. Vote: 64 In favor 45 Opposed.

It was moved and voted that the Town of Brookfield increase the 1980-81 budget limit established by Chapter 151 of the Acts of 1979 by \$49,867.40 so that the 1980-81 school budget as so increased and appropriated will be \$576,639.00.

It was moved and voted that the Town of Brookfield increase the appropriation limit established by Chapter 151 of the Acts of 1979 for fiscal 1981 by \$60,517.40 so that the total limit so increased will be \$929,907.00.

Meeting adjourned at 10:00 P.M.
