To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning July 1, 1982 in accordance with the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17.

It was voted to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning July 1, 1982 in accordance with the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17. Standing vote was unanimous.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen, to foreclose on Certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to act as the agent for the Town in the sale of a parcel of town-owned land located on Central Street, designated according to Assessors' records as Map 6C1, Lot 48, Plot 48 or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made that the Town vote to rescind the action of the Special Town Meeting on December 30, 1971 where it was voted to allow the town to sell to the Brookfield Development Corporation the parcel of land commonly known as the Johnson Lot for \$1.00 and authorize the Town or its agent to sell to Bruce Gadaire, said parcel of land for an amount of money to be agreed upon. This motion was amended to delete the purchaser, Bruce Gadaire and also put the parcel up for auction. It was then voted to rescind the action of the Special Town Meeting held on December 30, 1971 where it was voted to allow the town to sell to the Brookfield Development Corporation the Parcel of land commonly known as the Johnson Lot for \$1.00 and authorize the Town or its agent to sell said parcel of land at auction. Vote was 186-yes 1-no.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$2,500.00 to paint the interior of the Merrick Public Library or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer from Federal Revenue Sharing Funds the amount of \$2,500.00 for repairs to the Merrick Public Library.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money not in excess of \$11,000.00 to be used for the purchase of a police cruiser or take any action relative thereto.
