ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$4,000.00 to enter into an agreement with Tri-Link, Inc. and that this appropriation come under the control of the Board of Health, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to enter into an agreement with Tri-Link, Inc. and that this appropriation come under the control of the Board of Health.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a sidewalk sweeper for the Highway Department, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 from Revenue Sharing Funds to purchase a sidewalk sweeper for the Highway Department.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used for the installation of a new heating system for the Fire Station, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 and to expend from Revenue Sharing Funds the sum of \$5,000.00 to be used for the installation of a new heating system for the Fire Station.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used for the purchase of storm windows for the Merrick Public Library, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to expend from Revenue Sharing Funds the sum of \$2,500.00 to purchase storm windows for the Merrick Public Library.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used by the Selectmen for Town Hall improvements, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500.00 and to expend from Revenue Sharing Funds the sum of \$5,000.00 to be used by the Selectmen for Town Hall improvements.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a computer for the Town Hall, or take any action relative thereto.

A motion was made to appropriate the sum of 5,000.00 from Revenue Sharing Funds to purchase a computer for the Town Hall. Motion was defeated.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning July 1, 1985 in accordance with the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning July 1, 1985 in accordance with the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17. Standing vote was unanimous.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen to foreclose on certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to foreclose on certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen or their agent to sell for the town any land or building acquired by the Town by Tax Title foreclosure after first giving notice of said sale by posting a notice at the Town Hall and Post Office 14 days at least before said sale stating what parcels are to be sold, or offered for sale and the time and place of the holding of said sale, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to instruct the Selectmen or their agent to sell for the Town any land or building acquired by the Town by Tax Title foreclosure after first giving notice of said sale by posting a notice at the Town Hall and Post Office 14 days at least before said sale stating what parcels are to be sold, or offered for sale and the time and place of the holding of said sale.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to pay to the Town of Abington, Mass. the Town of Brookfield's share of benefits paid to Mary Palopoli, widow of Leonard Palopoli, due as a result of services rendered to the Town of Brookfield in the years 1931-40, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for appraisals, land acquisition, eminent domain takings and engineering services for the reconstruction of the southerly portion of Route 148. Vote was 57 In Favor, 32 Opposed. A request by Edward Requier to have it noted for the record that the Town has appropriated retroactively for eminent domain acquisition for which the property owners have not been notified and the Town has not informed and satisfactorily resolved this in a court of common jurisdiction.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a new checkwriter for the Treasurer's office, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,800.00 to purchase a new checkwriter for the Treasurer's office.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to provide a water supply for the dog pound, or take any action relative thereto.

it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to provide a water supply for the dog pound.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to designate certain roads in Town as Scenic Roads, according to Chapter 67, Acts of 1973, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to designate the following roads as Scenic Roads according to Chapter 67, Acts of 1973: East Main Street commencing at the junction of East Main St. and North Brookfield Rd. and continuing to the East Brookfield line; Lake Road from Route 148 to the Four Corners at South Pond; and Long Hill Road from Route 148 west to the West Brookfield line.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to transfer monies accumulated in the Highway Machinery Rental Account to the Highway Maintenance Fund and Purchase of New Equipment Account whenever they deem it necessary, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to transfer monies accumulated in the Highway Machinery Rental Account to the Highway Maintenance Fund and Purchase of New Equipment Account whenever they deem it necessary.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Library Extension Account (grant from the state) to the Public Library Account, or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate by transfer to the Library Fund Account the sum of money which was collected through December 31, 1984 for overdue books, or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to transfer all Grave Fees received up to December 31, 1984 to the Cemetery Appropriation Account, or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Cemetery Interest Account to the Cemetery Appropriation Account, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer the sum of \$7,725.00 from the Cemetery Interest Account to the Cemetery Appropriation Account.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate by transfer from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Fund to the Cemetery Improvement Account all the money received from the sale of lots up to December 31, 1984, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to appropriate by transfer from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Fund the sum of \$950.00 to the Cemetery Improvement Account which is all the money received from the sale of lots up to December 31, 1984.

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow the sum of \$20,000.00 to be used with or without funds allotted by the Commonwealth for the construction, reconstruction and improvement of town roads, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to transfer from Free Cash the sum of \$10,000.00 to the Stabilization Account.

ARTICLE 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money for the Reserve Account, or take any action relative thereto.

It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for the Reserve Account.
