

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
JUNE 26, 1990 7:00 P.M.

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Elections and Registrations Expense Account to the Elections and Registrations Salary Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Town Clerk).

The town voted to transfer the sum of \$135.00 from the Elections and Registrations Expense Account to the Elections and Registrations Salary Account.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Elections and Registrations Expense Account to the Town Clerk's Expense Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Town Clerk).

The town voted to transfer the sum of \$120.00 from the Elections and Registrations Expense Account to the Town Clerk's Expense Account.

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the responsibility and jurisdiction of the Cooley Hill Reservoir from the Board of Water Commissioners to the Board of Selectmen, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Water Commissioners)

The town voted to transfer the responsibility and jurisdiction of the Cooley Hill Reservoir from the Board of Water Commissioners to the Board of Selectmen.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to amend line item #24 of Article 2 of the May 1990 Annual Town Meeting entitled Assistant Building Inspector so as to provide compensation for a Zoning Enforcement Officer and an Assistant Building Inspector, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The town voted to amend line item #24 of Article 2 of the May 1990 Annual Town Meeting by allocating \$500.00 for the Assistant Building Inspector's salary to be paid at an hourly rate and \$1,000.00 for the Zoning Enforcement Officer's salary to be paid at an annual rate.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to provide a salary for the position of a full-time police chief or a part-time police chief and to transfer a sum of money therefore, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of money collected for swimming lessons to the South Pond Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The town voted to transfer the sum of \$350.00 from available funds to the South Pond Account.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Assessors to use a sum of money from available funds in the treasury for the reduction of the tax levy for the period from July 1, 1990 to June 30, 1991, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The town voted to authorize the Board of Assessors to use the sum of \$70,000.00 from available funds in the treasury for the reduction of the tax levy for the period from July 1, 1990 to June 30, 1991.






