ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 40, section 39A relative to the maintenance and operation of a water supply, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The Town voted to accept the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 40, section 39A relative to the maintenance and operation of a water supply.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 41, section 69B relative to the powers and duties of water commissioners, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The Town voted to accept the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 41, section 69B relative to the powers and duties of water commissioners.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money for an unpaid bill for fiscal year 1990 for the fire department, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$90.70 for an unpaid bill for fiscal year 1990 for the fire department. Vote: 62 Yes, 2 No

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant for Tantasqua Regional for fiscal year 1992 to be expended by the Tantasqua School Committee for direct service expenditures in the amount of \$27,078.00 under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Tantasqua Regional School Committee)

The Town voted to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant for Tantasqua Regional for fiscal year 1992 to be expended by the Tantasqua School Committee for direct service expenditures in the amount of \$27,078.00 under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant for Brookfield Elementary School for fiscal year 1992 to be expended by the Brookfield School Committee for direct service expenditures in the amount of \$32,201.00 under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Brookfield School Committee)

The Town voted to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant for Brookfield Elementary School for fiscal year 1992 to be expended by the Brookfield School Committee for direct service expenditures in the amount of \$32,201.00 under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money received from the Worcester County Dog Fund to the Library Expenses Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Library Trustees)

The Town voted to transfer the sum of \$2,845.89 which is money received from the Worcester County Dog Fund to the Library Expenses Account for fiscal year 1992.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the fiscal year 1991 Brookfield Elementary School budget to an account to be used for educational purposes in fiscal year 1992, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Brookfield School Committee)

The Town voted to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to amend Chapter V of the By-Laws of the Town of Brookfield by adding a Section 7 to allow for reimbursement of travel and out-of-pocket expenses for town officers and employees, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The Town voted to amend Chapter V of the By-Laws of the Town of Brookfield by adding a Section 7 which will read: "Reimbursement of travel expenses for town officers and employees will be allowed at the rate of \$.25 per mile". Vote: 45 Yes, 16 No

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to set up a revolving fund for recycling in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 275 of the Acts of 1990 to receive monies generated through the sale of recyclable materials and to expend monies for the maintenance and use of a recycling area, provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$1,000.00 in any fiscal year and that no monies shall be used to pay wages or salaries, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Recycling Committee)

The Town voted to set up a revolving fund for recycling in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 275 of the Acts of 1990 to receive monies generated through the sale of recyclable materials and to expend monies for the maintenance and use of a recycling area, provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$1,000.00 in any fiscal year and that no monies shall be used to pay wages or salaries.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m. 91 people attended the meeting.

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from the 1991-92 Brookfield Elementary School budget a sum of money to a new account to be called Tantasqua Regional Transportation Assessment Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Brookfield School Committee)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$68,827.00 from the 1991-92 Brookfield Elementary School budget to a new account to be called Tantasqua Regional Transportation Assessment Account.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from available funds to reduce the tax rate, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$5,000.00 from Free Cash to reduce the tax rate.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money for the Stabilization Fund, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$30,000.00 from Free Cash to the Stabilization Fund.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 18, the omnibus budget, of the 1991 annual town meeting, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The Town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to pay for dog license tags and books, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Town Clerk)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$300.00 from Free Cash to pay for dog license tags and books.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to pay for water testing near the town's water supply and in Quaboag Lake, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by petition)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$1,000.00 from Free Cash to pay for water testing near the town's water supply and in Quaboag Lake, to be administered by the Brookfield Board of Health.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:10 p.m. 34 people attended the meeting.
