

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
JUNE 26, 1992 7:00 P.M.

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Highway Expense Account to the Road Construction Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$2,000.00 from the Highway Expense Account to the Road Construction Account.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Highway Salary Account to the Road Construction Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$4,500.00 from the Highway Salary Account to the Road Construction Account.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money for the Municipal Fuel Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$3,700.00 from the Interest Temporary Loans Account to the Municipal Fuel Account.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used to upgrade the town's water rescue capabilities, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Civil Defense Department)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$1,500.00 from Free Cash to be used to upgrade the town's water rescue capabilities.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into any agreements necessary to include the Town of Brookfield in the creation of a regional dive team, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Civil Defense Department)

The Advisory Board makes no recommendation at this time.

The Town voted unanimously to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into any agreements necessary to include the Town of Brookfield in the creation of a regional dive team.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used to help support the creation of a regional dive team, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Civil Defense Department)

The Advisory Board makes no recommendation at this time.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$3,500.00 from Free Cash to be used to help support the creation of a regional dive team.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 2 of the town's Personnel By-Law by adding a new position entitled Recycling Monitor and to accept the job description for this position, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Personnel Board)

The Advisory Board makes no recommendation at this time.

The Town voted unanimously to amend Section 2 of the town's Personnel By-Law by adding a new position entitled Recycling Monitor and to accept the job description for this position.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to set up a revolving fund for recycling for FY 93 in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 275 of the Acts of 1990 to receive monies generated through the sale of recyclable materials and to expend monies for the maintenance and staffing of the recycling area provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$10,000.00, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Recycling Committee)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to set up a revolving fund for recycling for FY 93 in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 275 of the Acts of 1990 to receive monies generated through the sale of recyclable materials and to expend monies for the maintenance and staffing of the recycling area provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$10,000.00.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to amend Chapter XII of the by-laws of the Town of Brookfield by inserting the following by-law under Section 3: "Every private inground swimming pool shall be enclosed by a fence not less than four (4) feet in height and firmly secured at ground level. Such enclosures, including gates therein, shall not be less than four (4) feet in height and any gate shall be self-latching or otherwise made inaccessible from the outside to children up to eight (8) years of age. Any above ground pools must be likewise secured. Public and semi-public outdoor inground swimming pools must conform to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Building Code.", or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Planning Board, Building Department and Board of Health)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted by a majority vote to amend Chapter XII of the by-laws of the Town of Brookfield by inserting the following by-law under Section 3: "Every private inground swimming pool shall be enclosed by a fence not less than four (4) feet in height and firmly secured at ground level. Such enclosures, including gates therein, shall not be less than four (4) feet in height and any gate shall be self-latching or otherwise made secure from the outside. Any above ground pools must be likewise secured. Public and semi-public outdoor inground swimming pools must conform to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Building Code."

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Interest Temporary Loans Account to the Banking Services Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Treasurer)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$1,300.00 from the Interest Temporary Loans Account to the Banking Services Account.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Historical Commission Expense Account to a new account to be called the Historical Commission Preservation Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Historical Commission)

The Advisory Board recommends this article.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$597.00 from the Historical Commission Expense Account to a new account to be called the Historical Commission Preservation Account.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:28 p.m. 118 people attended the meeting.


