ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Insect and Pest Control Account to the Highway Salary Account, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Dutch Elm Account to the Highway Salary Account, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$1,950.00 from the Dutch Elm Account to the Highway Salary Account.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Tree Warden Account to the Highway Salary Account, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to replace monies in the Police Salaries Account that were spent for details at the Mayo property and the blizzards of 1992 and 1993, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$1200.00 from the Group Insurance Account to the Police Salaries Account to replace monies that were spent for details at the Mayo property and the blizzards of 1992 and 1993.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used to cover a deficit in the Civil Defense Expense Account for services rendered during the blizzards of 1992 and 1993, or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 1. ELECTION - BALLOT

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993 in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993 in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to foreclose on certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to foreclose on certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen or their agent to sell for the town any land or building acquired by the Town by Tax Title foreclosure after first giving notice of said sale by posting a notice at the Town Hall and Post Office 14 days at least before said sale stating what parcels are to be sold, or offered for sale and the time and place of holding said sale, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to instruct the Selectmen or their agent to sell for the town any land or building acquired by the Town by Tax Title foreclosure after first giving notice of said sale by posting a notice at the Town Hall and Post Office 14 days at least before said sale stating what parcels are to be sold, or offered for sale and the time and place of holding said sale.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Fund to the Cemetery Improvement Account all the money received from the sale of lots up to December 31, 1992, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to transfer the sum of \$5,603.00 from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Fund to the Cemetery Improvement Account which is all the money received from the sale of lots up to December 31, 1992.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Treasurer to enter into a compensating balance agreement or agreements for fiscal year 1994 pursuant to Chapter 44, section 53F of the Massachusetts General Laws, or take any action relative thereto.

The town voted unanimously to authorize its Treasurer to enter into a compensating balance agreement or agreements for fiscal year 1994 pursuant to Chapter 44, section 53F of the Massachusetts General Laws.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant for the Brookfield Elementary School for fiscal year 1994 under the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985 and to be expended by the school department for direct service expenditures, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Brookfield School Committee)

The town voted unanimously to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant in the amount of \$63,489.00 for the Brookfield Elementary School for fiscal year 1994 under the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985 and to be expended by the school department for direct service expenditures.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant for the Tantasqua Regional School District for fiscal year 1994 under the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985 and to be expended by the school department for direct service expenditures, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Tantasqua Regional School Committee)

The town voted unanimously to accept an Equal Education Opportunity Grant in the amount of \$244,399.00 for the Tantasqua Regional School District for fiscal year 1994 under the provisions of Mass. General Laws Chapter 70A, section 5, as inserted by Chapter 188 of the Acts of 1985 and to be expended by the school department for direct service expenditures.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to make a substantial number of changes in the town's Personnel By-law. A copy of this By-Law with the proposed changes will be available for review in the Selectmen's office, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Personnel Board)

The town voted by a majority to amend Section 23, part a by adding to the end of the sentence: "except where by vote of the Selectmen and the Personnel Board, crosstraining is in the best interest of the town."

The town voted to table this article until June 25, 1993 at 7:30 p.m.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 40, section 22F which relates to fees and charges for licenses and permits issued by town boards, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Planning Board and the Selectmen)

The town voted unanimously to adopt the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 40, section 22F which relates to fees and charges for licenses and permits issued by town boards.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its representatives to the General Court to support legislation filed by the Mass. Municipal Association that would establish in state law a Local Roads Fund in order to ensure a fair and predictable share of state gas tax collections for distribution to cities and towns for use on local roads, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Selectmen)

The town voted unanimously to instruct its representatives to the General Court to support legislation filed by the Mass. Municipal Association that would establish in state law a Local Roads Fund in order to ensure a fair and predictable share of state gas tax collections for distribution to cities and towns for use on local roads.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its representatives to the General Court to support an amendment to the FY 94 state budget to guarantee that cities and towns receive the full \$47 million growth in lottery revenues, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Selectmen)

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to rescind Article #39 of the May 2, 1983 annual town meeting and to vote to transfer the jurisdiction of the Lewis property to the Brookfield Recreation Commission and the Brookfield Board of Selectmen for future development as a recreational area, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Selectmen and the Recreation Commission)

The town voted by a majority to rescind Article #39 of the May 2, 1983 annual town meeting and to vote to transfer the jurisdiction of the Lewis property to the Brookfield Recreation Commission for future development as a recreational area, such plans subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to make a substantial number of changes in the town's Personnel By-law. A copy of this By-Law with the proposed changes will be available for review in the Selectmen's office, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Personnel Board)

The town voted to amend the Town of Brookfield Personnel By-Law by adopting the Personnel By-Law entitled Town of Brookfield Personnel By-Law Revised and Acted upon at the May 7, 1993 and June 25, 1993 Annual Town Meeting. The town voted by a majority to amend Section 23 to read: "Any employee, as described in section 3, under (A) Full time, (B) Part time (20-35) or (C) Part time (less than 20) should be reimbursed for tuition, fees and required materials for education and training only if all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- a. amended at May 7th annual town meeting
- b. Adequate funds for reimbursement must have been included and be currently available in the approved budget of the department making the request.
- c. not changed
- d. not changed

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the ensuing year, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The town voted by a majority to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to pay to the town of Abington, Mass. the town of Brookfield's share of benefits paid to Mary Palopoli, widow of Leonard Palopoli, due as a result of services rendered to the Town of Brookfield in the years 1931-40, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Treasurer)

The town voted unanimously to transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$2,267.20 to pay to the town of Abington, Mass. the town of Brookfield's share of benefits paid to Mary Palopoli, widow of Leonard Palopoli, due as a result of services rendered to the Town of Brookfield in the years 1931-40.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used with or without funds allotted by the Commonwealth for the construction, reconstruction and improvement of town roads, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Selectmen)

The town voted unanimously to transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$15,000.00 to be used with or without funds allotted by the Commonwealth for the construction, reconstruction and improvement of town roads.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a tractor to mow roadsides, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Highway Supt. and the Selectmen)

The town voted unanimously to transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$7,500.00 to purchase a tractor to mow roadsides.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Assessors to appoint one of their members as Clerk to the Board of Assessors and pay compensation in addition to the Assessors' salary, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Assessors)

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a new computer system for the Town Clerk's office and to set up files, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Town Clerk)

The town voted by a majority to transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$1,100.00 to purchase a 386 DOS computer system for the Town Clerk's office and to set up files for this system.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to complete Step II in the long-term plan to control iron and manganese in the aquifer at the Quaboag Street pumping station in accordance with the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 41, section 69B, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Water Commissioners)

The town voted unanimously to borrow a sum of money, under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 8, subsection 5, not to exceed \$90,000.00, to complete Step II in the long-term plan to control iron and manganese in the aquifer at the Quaboag Street pumping station, in accordance with the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 41, section 69B.

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to be used for Enhanced 911 education, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Civil Defense Department)

The town voted unanimously to transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used for Enhanced 911 education.

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a lawnmower to mow the Common and ballfield, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Highway Supt. and Selectmen)

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money for the New Ambulance Fund, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Emergency Squad)

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to purchase a new cruiser, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Police Department)

The town voted by a majority to transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$16,000.00 to purchase a new cruiser and that the Selectmen be in charge of disposing of the old one.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money for the Stabilization Account, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Board)

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Assessors to use a sum of money from available funds in the Treasury for the reduction of the Tax Levy for the period from July 1, 1993 to June 30, 1994, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Assessors)

The town voted unanimously to pass over this article.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 p.m. Eighty people attended.
