To either of the Constables of the Town of Brookfield in the County of Worcester: GREETING:

IN THE NAME OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town, qualified to vote in elections and in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, Banquet Hall in said town on Wednesday the nineteenth of July at 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles:

Article 1. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to lease and renovate property to be used as a police station for up to ten years or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Selectmen)

The Town voted by a majority to transfer \$7,500.00 from the Police Station Improvement Account and \$25,775.00 from Stabilization to the Police Station Lease and Renovate Expense Account.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town's By-laws, Chapter II, Section 1 concerning the date of the Annual Town Election and Annual Town Meeting or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Selectmen)

The Town voted unanimously to amend the Town's By-Laws, Chapter II, Section 1 by changing the Annual Town Election to the first Monday of May each year and the Annual Town Meeting to the first Friday following the Annual Town Election and to make this change ongoing with the year 2001.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to fund any unpaid FY2000 bills or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Selectmen)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$982.65 from Stabilization and \$974.00 from Cemetery Perpetual Care Interest Trust for a total of \$1956.65 to the Unpaid Bills Expense Account.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to supplement the election expense account or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by Town Clerk)

The Town voted to pass over this article.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to supplement the election salary account or take action relative thereto. (Sponsored by Town Clerk)

The Town voted to pass over this article.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to fund an invoice dated September 24, 1998 from CMRPC that was misplaced in the Town Hall or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored Board of Health)

The Town voted to pass over this Article.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the interest accrued from the cemetery expense account to cover cost of unforeseen equipment repairs or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Cemetery Commissioners)
The Town voted to pass over this article.

Article 8. To see if the Town will establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Recreation Committee under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E1/2 and receive monies derived from the registrations and relative applications, provided all monies received be deposited into said revolving fund provided that no monies shall exceed \$5,000 or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Recreation Committee)

The town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Recreation Committee under M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 53E 1/2 and receive monies derived from the registrations and relative applications provided no monies shall be expended in excess of \$5,000.00.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Recreation Expense account to the Recreation Revolving account or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Recreation Committee)

The Town voted to pass over this article.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant, by posting up attested copies thereof, at the Town Hall and Post Office in said Town, fourteen days at least before the time of the holding of said meeting.

HEREOF, FAIL NOT, and make due return of this Warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk, at the time and place of the meeting, as aforesaid. Given under our hands this fifth of July in the year of our Lord, two thousand.




