IN THE NAME OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town, qualified to vote in elections and in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, Banquet Hall in said town on Monday, the seventh day of May next from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., then and there to act on the following article:

ARTICLE 1 To elect all on one ballot the following officers: One Moderator for one year; One Selectman for three years; One Town Clerk for three years; One Treasurer for three years; One Assessor for three years; One member of the Elementary School Committee for three years; One member of the Regional School Committee for three years; One Water Commissioner for three years; Two Constables for three years; One member of the Board of Health for three years; One member of the Planning Board for five years; Two Trustees for Merrick Public Library for three years. One Cemetery Commissioner for three years; One Trustee for Shade Tree & Cemetery Funds for three years.

Also to meet at the Brookfield Elementary School, Friday, May 11, 2001 at 7:30 p.m. to act on the following:

ARTICLE 2 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the ensuing year, or take any action relative thereto.

The Town voted by a majority vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the ensuing year.

An amendment was made in the budget to the line item of Town Accountants' Professional Services it is as follows:

The Town voted by a majority to have the Board of Selectmen and Town Accountant research the amount of time and expense it would take to reconcile the Town's books and certify free cash, a report to be made at the first Town Meeting held after August 11, 2001.

ARTICLE 3 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001 in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, section 17. (Sponsored by the Treasurer)

The Town voted unanimously to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001 in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, section 4 and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, section 17.

ARTICLE 4 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to foreclose on certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Treasurer)

The Town voted unanimously to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to foreclose on certain Tax Titles held by the Treasurer.

ARTICLE 5 To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen or their agent to sell for the town any land or building acquired by the town by Tax Title foreclosure after first giving notice of said sale by posting a notice at the Town Hall and Post Office 14 days at least before said sale stating what parcels are to be sold, or offered for sale and the time and place of holding said sale, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Tax Collector)

The Town voted unanimously to instruct the Selectmen or their agent to sell for the town any land or building acquired by the town by Tax Title foreclosure after first giving notice of said sale by posting a notice at the Town Hall and Post Office 14 days at least before said sale stating what parcels are to be sold, or offered for sale and the time and place of holding said sale.

ARTICLE 6 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Health to appoint one of its members to hold the position of Health Agent and to provide compensation therefore, or take any action relative thereto.

(Sponsored by the Board of Health)

The Town voted unanimously to authorize the Board of Health to appoint one of its members to hold the position of Health Agent and to provide compensation therefore.

ARTICLE 7 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Health to appoint one of its members to be the Title V Administrator and to provide compensation therefore, or take any action relative thereto.

(Sponsored by the Board of Health)

The Town voted unanimously to authorize the Board of Health to appoint one of its members to be the Title V Administrator and to provide compensation therefore.

ARTICLE 8 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Health to appoint one of its members to be the Transfer Station Administrator and to provide compensation therefore, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Board of Health)

The Town voted unanimously to authorize the Board of Health to appoint one of its members to be the Transfer Station Administrator and to provide compensation therefore.

ARTICLE 9 To see if the Town will vote to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Local Public Access under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to authorize the license fee paid by Charter Cable and all monies raised through advertising and fundraising to be deposited in said revolving fund, provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$15,000.00, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Local Public Access Committee)

The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Local Public Access under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to authorize the license fee paid by Charter Cable and all monies raised through advertising and fundraising to be deposited in said revolving fund, provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$15,000.00.

ARTICLE 10 To see if the Town will vote to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Planning Board under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to receive monies derived from engineering fees charged in relation to reviews of applications submitted to the Board and to expend these monies to pay all costs associated with professional engineering review of said applications provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$2,000.00, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Planning Board)

The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Planning Board under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to receive monies derived from engineering fees charged in relation to reviews of applications submitted to the Board and to expend these monies to pay all costs associated with professional engineering review of said applications provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$2,000.00.

ARTICLE 11 To see if the Town will vote to establish a revolving fund for the Library Trustees under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to receive monies derived from fines collected on overdue materials and copies and to expend these monies to pay for replacement of materials, maintenance and supplies for the copy machine provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$1,000.00, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Library Trustees)

The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund for the Library Trustees under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to receive monies derived from fines collected on overdue materials and copies and to expend these monies to pay for replacement of materials, maintenance and supplies for the copy machine provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$1,000.00.

ARTICLE 12 To see if the Town will vote to transfer from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Account to the Cemetery Improvement account all the money received from the sale of lots up to December 31, 2000, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Cemetery Commissioners)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$2,476.66 from the Cemetery Sale of Lots Account to the Cemetery Improvement Account, this sum is all the money received from the sale of lots up to December 31, 2000.

ARTICLE 13 To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the interest accrued from the Cemetery Perpetual Trust Funds to the Cemetery Expenses Account, or take any action relative thereto.
(Sponsored by the Cemetery Commissioners)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$1,100.00 from the interest accrued from the Cemetery Perpetual Trust Funds to the Cemetery Expenses Account.

ARTICLE 14 To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the interest accrued from the Cemetery Perpetual Trust Funds Account to the Cemetery Improvement Account for funding the survey and planning project with the Brookfield Historical Commission. or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Cemetery Commissioners)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$16,600.00 from the interest accrued from the Cemetery Perpetual Trust Funds Account to the Cemetery Improvement Account for funding the survey and planning project with the Brookfield Historical Commission.

ARTICLE 15 To see if the Town will vote to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Recreation Committee under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to receive monies derived from the registrations and relative applications provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$5,000.00, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Recreation Committee)

The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund for the Brookfield Recreation Committee under M.G.L. Chapter 44, section 53E 1/2 and to receive monies derived from the registrations and relative applications provided that no monies shall be expended in excess of \$5,000.00.

ARTICLE 16 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Highway Construction, Reconstruction and Improvement of Town Roads Account be used with or without funds allotted by the Commonwealth or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Highway Dept) Amount requested \$20,000.

The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate \$20,000.00 to the Highway Construction, Reconstruction and Improvement of Town Roads Account be used with or without funds allotted by the Commonwealth

ARTICLE 17 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Abington Retirement Expense Account to pay the Town of Brookfield's share of benefits paid to Mary Palopoli, widow of Leonard Palopoli, due as a result of services rendered to the Town of Brookfield in the years 1931-40, or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Treasurer)

I move that the Town vote to raise and appropriate \$2,267.20 to the Abington Retirement Expense Account to pay the Town of Brookfield's share of benefits paid to Mary Palopoli, widow of Leonard Palopoli, due as a result of services rendered to the Town of Brookfield in the years 1931-40.

ARTICLE 18 To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Ambulance Billing Receipts Account which was established according to Chapter 40, Section 5F to fund the Emergency Squad Salary Account for fiscal year 2002 or take any action relative thereto.





This is to certify that at the reconvened session of the Annual Town Meeting held on May 18, 2001, that Article 21 was voted on and unanimously approved, it is as follows:

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning By-law to residential development in a business district upon the issuance of a special permit by the Planning Board, by modifying the Use Regulation Table so that Business A and Business B columns in entries 2a, 2b, 2c, and 2g are changed from 'N' to 'SP'.

The Town voted unanimously to amend the Zoning By-law to residential development in a business district upon the issuance of a special permit by the Planning Board, by modifying the *Use Regulation Table* so that *the Business A and Business B columns in entries 2a, 2b, 2c and 2g are changed from 'N' to 'SP'*; to allow owners of property in the business districts the possibilities of using their land for residential purposes.

The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$81,630.00 from the Ambulance Billing Receipts Account, which was established according to Chapter 40, Section 5F to fund the Emergency Squad Salary Account for fiscal year 2002.

ARTICLE 19 To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Ambulance Billing Receipts Account which was established according to Chapter 40, Section 5F to fund the Ambulance Expense Account for fiscal year 2002 or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Emergency Squad)

The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$20,000 from the Ambulance Billing Receipts Account, which was established according to Chapter 40, Section 5F to fund the Ambulance Expense Account for fiscal year 2002.

ARTICLE 21 To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Law to allow residential development in a business district upon the issuance of a special permit by the Planning Board, by modifying the Use Regulation Table so that the Business A and the Business B columns in entries 2a, 2b, 2c and 2g are changed from "N" to "SP" or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Planning Board)

The Town voted unanimously to amend the Zoning By-Law to allow residential development in a business district upon the issuance of a special permit by the Planning Board, by modifying the Use Regulation Table so that the Business A and the Business B columns in entries 2a, 2b, 2c and 2g are changed from "N" to "SP"; to allow owners of property in the business districts the possibility of using their land for residential purposes.

ARTICLE 22 To see if the Town will vote to establish a committee to analyze the necessity of creating a Brookfield Town Manager/Administrator position and further if the creation of such a position is recommended, the committee will also be responsible for overseeing the development of job description, establishing qualifications and recommending a salary and further to recommend, no later than next year's Town Meeting, a method to cause said position to be established.

The Town Manager/Administrator Committee may consist of seven members: one from the Board of Selectmen, one from the Advisory Committee, one from the Personnel Board and four citizens chosen by the Town Moderator. The four citizens chosen will, as much as possible, have backgrounds in municipal finance, public administration, business administration, accounting, law, human resources or other similar fields or take any action thereto. (Sponsored by Petition)

The Town voted by a majority vote to establish a committee to analyze the necessity of creating a Brookfield Town Manager/Administrator position and further if the creation of such a position is recommended, the committee will also be responsible for overseeing the development of job description, establishing qualifications and recommending a salary and further to recommend, no later than next year's Town Meeting, a method to cause said position to be established.

The Town Manager/Administrator Committee may consist of seven members: one from the Board of Selectmen, one from the Advisory Committee, one from the Personnel Board and four citizens chosen by the Town Moderator. The four citizens chosen will, as much as possible, have backgrounds in municipal finance, public administration, business administration, accounting, law, human resources or other similar fields.

ARTICLE 23 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Lakes and Ponds Grant Account be used as the Towns share of matching funds to be used with the Lakes and Pond Grant awarded by the Department of Environmental Management to stop the spread and to control exotic weed growth in Quacumquasit (South) Pond or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by QQLA).

ARTICLE 29 To see if the Town will vote to amend the Agreement of the Regional School District for the five Towns of Brimfield, Brookfield, Holland, Sturbridge and Wales, Section III Apportionment of Cost, Part b, Operating Expenses, so that starting in FY 2003 each Town pays its own "Net Minimum Contribution" plus its enrollment-based share of the costs that exceed the region's total "Net Minimum Contribution" or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Advisory Committee)

An amendment to the motion was voted on and approved, it is as follows:

The Town voted by a majority vote to amend the Agreement of the Regional School District for the five Towns of Brimfield, Brookfield, Holland, Sturbridge and Wales, Section III Apportionment of Cost, Part b, Operating Expenses, by adding the following paragraph: "However commencing in Fiscal 2003, operating expenses shall be apportioned such that each Participating Town pays its state-mandated minimum local contribution plus a share of the District's operating expenses that exceed the District's state-mandated net school spending requirement, that share being based on the Participating Town's enrollment in the Regional District School, as determined above."

ARTICLE 30 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Off of Draper Street Account for the Town to purchase land off of Draper Street for the location of future standpipes or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Water Department)

I move that the Town vote to raise and appropriate \$35,000 to the Off of Draper Street Land Purchase Account for the Town to purchase land off of Draper Street (Map/Lot) for the location of future standpipes.

The Town voted to pass over this Article.

ARTICLE 31 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Prouty Street Account for the Town to purchase land on Prouty Street for Municipal Buildings or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Comprehensive Facilities Committee)

I move that the Town vote to raise and appropriate \$\$\$ to the Prouty Street Land Purchase Account for the Town to purchase land on Prouty Street (Map/Lot 6C-1-36, 6C-1-37, 6C -1-38, 6C-1-152) for Municipal Buildings

The voted to pass over this article.

ARTICLE 32 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Highway Building Expense Account to construct an addition or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Fire and Highway Departments)

I move that the Town vote to raise and appropriate \$\$ to the Highway Building Expense Account to construct an addition to be used to house Highway and Fire Department Vehicles and Equipment.

The Town voted to pass over this Article.

ARTICLE 33 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow a sum of money to the Fire Department Capital Improvement Account for future purchases or take any action relative thereto. (Sponsored by the Fire Department.)

I move that the Town vote to raise and appropriate

\$\$ to the Fire Department Capital Improvement Account.

The Town voted to pass over this Article.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant, by posting up attested copies thereof, at the Town Hall and Post Office in said Town, fourteen days at least before the time of the holding of said meeting.
